A booster seat positions the seat belt so

Keep your child in a booster seat until he or she is big enough to fit in a seat belt properly. For a seat belt to fit properly the lap belt must lie snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach. The shoulder belt should lie sour across the shoulder and chest and not cross the neck or face. Remember: your child should still ride in the back seat because it's safer there.

upper thighs and be snug across the shoulder and chest to restrain the child

safely in a crash. It should not rest on

the stomach area or across the neck
